LATEST UPDATE FROM MARIN HUMANE

Marin Humane is the designated lead agency coordinating animal-related disaster response for the county of Marin. **The shelter is still accepting domestic pets of evacuees for free emergency boarding. Animals can be brought to:**

If possible, bring veterinary records and any pet meds. Food and bedding will be provided. If you're animal is very sick, please go to a veterinary hospital. Although Marin Humane is equipped for basic care, it is not a critical care facility.

Latest Details - 10/14/17, 4 pm

- Currently, Marin Humane has accepted close to 400 pets of evacuees but that number changes hourly. Animals include dogs, cats, birds, fowl, fish, reptiles, rabbits, and rodents.
- Marin Humane has sent Animal Services Officers to the fire zone daily to assist Sonoma County Animal Services in bringing animals to safety and conducting welfare checks on pets.
- Marin Humane is also managing all aspects of animal care for the pets of evacuees who are co-locating with them at Marin County evacuation centers, including the Civic Center in San Rafael and the Seminary in Mill Valley.

Currently, Marin Humane does *not* need donations of food, supplies or volunteers, but monetary donations are much appreciated and can be made at marinhumane.org/fires.
